

What is a TFR?

A Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR) is a type of Notice to Airmen (NOTAM). A TFR defines an area restricted to air travel due to a hazardous condition, a special event, or as in this case a restriction within the national airspace system.

14 CFR Part 91.141 reads as follows: No person may operate an aircraft over or in the vicinity of any area to be visited or traveled by the President, the Vice President, or other public figures contrary to the restrictions established by the Administrator and published in a Notice to Airmen (NOTAM).



Presidential TFR

- Active during published times
- Typically published 48 hours in advance
- Surface to 17,999
- Inner Circle Non-Typical 12nm radius
- Outer Circle typically 30nm radius
- Watch out for TFRs in Class B Don't confuse the two
- Over 200 Airports within the 30NM Wilmington Ring







Operating Legally In And Out Of A TFR




These procedures describe a typical Security TFR. Check <u>published TFR</u> for any unique procedures.


- Avoid the TFR entirely
 - -Give it a 3-5 mile buffer
 - -Violation based on ATC overlay, not your GPS

Generally Speaking within 12 NM

- The POTUS TFR will consist of a 12 nm inner core and a 30 nm outer core.
- When the TFR is active, all operations will be prohibited in the 12 nm inner core of the TFR, except:—
 - POTUS aircraft
 - Military aircraft supporting the U.S. Secret Service
 - Approved law enforcement, air ambulance, and firefighting operations
 - Scheduled commercial and cargo flights under TSA Standard Security Programs, if applicable.
 - General aviation aircraft using specific gateway airport screening procedures, which will be outlined in the TFRs, if applicable.
- If its not listed in not permitted!!

Between 12.01 and 30 NM

- The POTUS TFR will consist of a 12 nm inner core and a 30 nm outer core.
- When the TFR is active, Operations between the 12 and 30NM ring-
- AIRCRAFT ARRIVING OR DEPARTING LOCAL AIRFIELDS,
- ALL AIRCRAFT MUST BE ON AN ACTIVE IFR OR FILED VFR FLIGHT PLAN WITH A DISCRETE CODE ASSIGNED BY AN AIR TRAFFIC CONTROL (ATC) FACILITY. AIRCRAFT MUST BE SQUAWKING THE DISCRETE CODE PRIOR TO DEPARTURE AND AT ALLTIMES WHILE IN THE TFR AND MUST REMAIN IN TWO-WAY RADIO COMMUNICATIONS WITH ATC.
- AND WORKLOAD PERMITTING, ATC MAY AUTHORIZE TRANSIT OPERATIONS.
- AIRCRAFT MAY NOT LOITER.
- If its not listed it's not permitted!!



Generally Speaking

- THE FOLLOWING OPERATIONS ARE NOT AUTHORIZED WITHIN THIS TFR:
- FLIGHT TRAINING, PRACTICE INSTRUMENT APPROACHES,
- AEROBATIC FLIGHT,
- GLIDER OPERATIONS,
- PARACHUTE OPERATIONS,
- ULTRALIGHT, HANG GLIDING,
- BALLOON OPERATIONS,
- AGRICULTURE/CROP DUSTING,
- ANIMAL POPULATION CONTROL FLIGHT OPERATIONS,
- BANNER TOWING OPERATIONS,
- SIGHTSEEING OPERATIONS,
- MAINTENANCE TEST FLIGHTS,
- MODEL AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS, MODEL ROCKETRY, UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS (UAS), AND UTILITY AND PIPELINE SURVEY OPERATIONS.

Whoops!!!?

- I busted the Presidential TFR, now what?
 - How will I know
 - Still in the air
 - You may get to see a fighter jet or helicopter up close
 - ATC May call on the radio
 - Just landed
 - You'll be notified
 - · Someone may be waiting for you
- The FSDO is calling
 - Should I answer/call them back

-YES



Whoops!!!?

- What is the FSDO going to do to me?
 - -Get to the root cause
 - Ensure you get training to prevent it from reoccurring
 - Ground and/or Flight Training
 - –Certificate action (if you are a repeat offender)

Rocking Aircraft & Flashing Navigational Lighting – after acknowledgement, slow level turn to desired heading	Intercepted follow me	Rocking Aircraft & Flashing Navigational Lighting – and Following	Understood will comply
Abrupt break-away from intercept aircraft – climbing turn of 90 degrees w/o crossing line of flight of intercepted A/C	You may proceed	Rocking the Aircraft	Understood will comply
Lowering landing gear, showing steady landing lights and overflying runway in use	Land at this aerodrome	Lowering landing gear, showing steady landing lights and following the intercepting aircraft – proceed to land	Understood will comply



Signals Initiated by Intercepted Aircraft

Intercepted A/C	Meaning	Intercepting A/C	Meaning
Raising landing gear/flashing landing lights while passing over runway in use – continuing to circle runway in use	Aerodrome designated is inadequate	- If desired that intercepted A/C follow to alternate — Intercepting A/C raises its gear If decide to release intercepted A/C — Intercepting A/C uses (You may proceed) signals — abrupt break-away	Understood follow me
Regular switching on and off of all available lights but in such a manner as to be distinct from flashing lights	Cannot comply	Rocking the Aircraft	Understood
